HOW MUCH DOES YOUR DONATION HELP?

A single hospital patient can require a large amount of blood in a single situation.



CANCER PATIENTS: Up to eight platelet units per week



HEART SURGERY: Up to six red blood cell units + six platelet units



BURN VICTIMS:
Up to 20 plasma units



ORGAN TRANSPLANTS:
Up to 25 plasma units + 30 platelet units + 40 red blood cell units



AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENTS:
Up to 50 red blood cell units



PREMATURE INFANTS: Up to five units of red blood cells

Human blood cannot be manufactured.

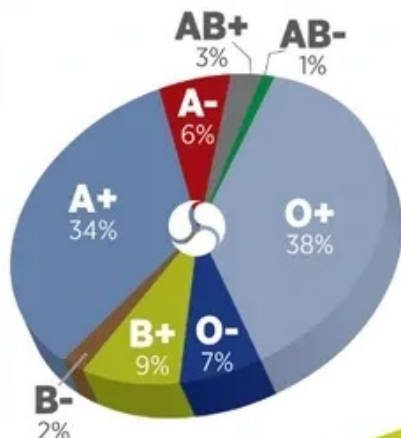
DID YOU KNOW?

- One pint of whole blood - the most common form of donation - can impact up to three lives!
- Someone needs blood every two seconds.
- Less than 10% of the eligible U.S. population (38%) donates annually.
- There is no substitute for human blood.
- One in seven people entering a hospital need blood.
- Females receive 53% of blood transfusions. Males receive 47%.
- One unit of blood can be separated into three components: red blood cells, plasma and platelets.
- Fourteen tests (eleven for infectious diseases) are performed on each unit of donated blood.
- Healthy adults who are 16 years old and weigh at least 110 pounds are eligible to donate whole blood.

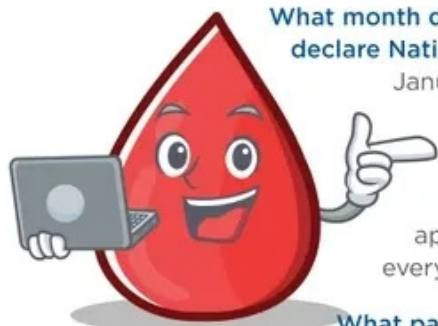
Blood Type By American Population

What month did President Richard Nixon declare National Blood Donor Month?
January.

How many miles do blood cells travel in your body?

Blood cells travel approximately 70,000 miles every 20 seconds.

What part of the human body does not access the body's blood supply?

The human cornea extracts oxygen directly from the air, so it does not access the body's blood supply.

What is the probability that an individual will require a blood transfusion in their lifetime?

If a person lives to age 72, there is a 90% chance he or she will have a need for blood or blood products.

How many units of blood did President Ronald Reagan require after an assassination attempt?

12 total units – 8 units of red blood cells, 3 units of plasma, and 1 unit of platelets. Over a dozen strangers helped save his life through blood donation!

In what major war in the United States were the first two transfusion events recorded?

In the Civil War, a syringed direct transfusion was successfully performed on two occasions. Blood groups weren't identified at this time, so the odds of a successful transfusion were attributed more to luck rather than skill!

What is an essential when the president travels?

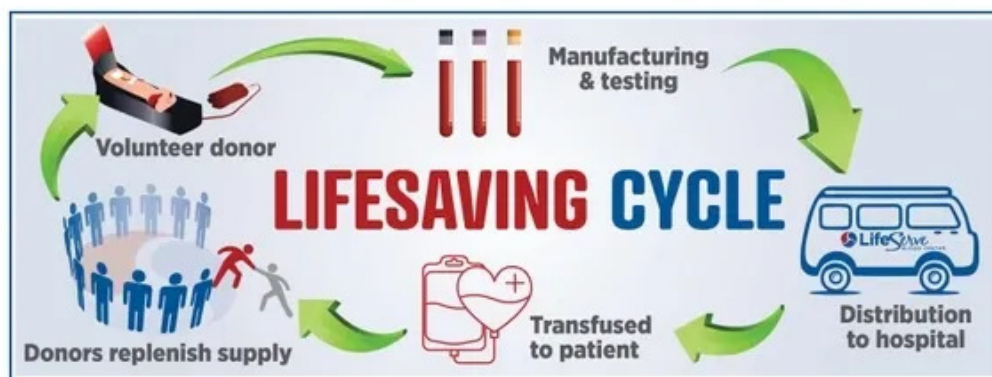
Among other things, the presidential state car features a blood bank of the president's blood type.
