

## Talking Points: 2022 Accounting Opportunities Week\*



The below talking points are provided to help frame your discussion with the high school students. Many of the students will not have a clear understanding of what accountants do; however many will have misconceptions about the profession. This is an *opportunity* to disprove several of the stereotypes while talking about how exciting and worthwhile the accounting profession is. The more positive stories and examples you share, the more engaged the students.

While it's easy to focus on the challenges (long hours, tough CPA Exam, etc.) please remember we are hoping to encourage these students to consider a career in accounting and keep your message positive – truthful, but positive!

Where did you attend college? / What was your major?
Did you have any internships?

If applicable, what was your CPA Exam experience? *Try to focus on the positives
What is your position now?
Talk about your industry: What is public/private industry/GNP/etc. accounting?
Typical Day
What is a typical workday like for you?
How did the pandemic impact your organization?
Are you able to work from home?

What is the difference between an accountant and a CPA?

Accounting Competencies and Skills
What are the key skills you need as an accountant?
Choose two or three of the following success skills and talk about how you used these in your career.

What are some of the perks of being an accountant?
There are so many perks that come with being an accountant and this is a chance to show the
students that accounting is more than taxes and calculations.

High Salary: accountants frequently are frequently earning a competitive salary. Interns even get paid!

4) Teamwork: accountants often work in teams.

2) Open Doors: The CPA license earns a CPA instant credibility. If applicable, talk about how
your CPA license has benefited you.
